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Introduction

When God made the statement "Let us make man in our image..." What if that tasty fruit would actually make her smarter and even more powerful?

One simple question did everything necessary to contaminate and corrupt Eve's mind. Once the spark of curiosity was exposed to the volatile fuel of her human imagination, the unquenchable fire of sin was set ablaze and totally destroyed man's innocence. In a single moment, mankind descended from the highest pinnacle of God's favor to the depths of His repulsion. Even His love for His unique human race could not overrule His holy justice. Sin cannot ever exist in God's presence, and neither can sinful man.

The Long Road to Recovery

In the process of this disobedience, man lost both his honored position and godly provision. Man's oncepurposeful life changed completely from its original purpose and design.

Psalm 42:1-2

As the deer pants for the water brooks, so my soul pants for Thee, o God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God; when shall I come and appear before God?

In man's most worshipful moments, there is a longing deep inside his heart to be surrounded by the presence of God. There is very little explanation as to the reason for such a longing, but we all feel it. Our worshipful hearts can be completely overwhelmed by the knowledge of God's presence. It is not unusual to get choked up in worship services as we sense that something intimate is missing. Our sinful heart longs desperately for intimacy that he senses is missing.

We know that "walking in the light" is the process of allowing God's Holy Spirit to direct our attitudes and actions. But isn't it strange that a person who chooses to walk in the light at one moment, may at other times deliberately choose to walk in darkness. What is at the base of this paradox? What we will learn from this study is that man was originally created clothed in God's glory. God's glory was man's appointed garment. Man was meant to wear God's glory forever.

In the Beginning

Man was created "complete." He was made in the image of God and made completely for God's glory. It was a perfect situation. God created within man a need for God Himself. It was a perfect plan. Man needed God, God was glorified in fulfilling that need, and man felt complete in the process. The creation of man was God's joy. Man was created in God's image and was clothed in God's glory. This cycle of fulfillment was the God-ordained process of walking in the light, the very same principle that believers enjoy today.

We cannot so much as imagine the beauty of God's original creation or the purpose that Adam and Eve lived in. Our human minds cannot conceive of, nor is there a medium created on this Earth that can adequately describe, the relationship that they experienced as everyday life.

Genesis 2:25

The man and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame.

But something went terrible wrong. Man, who was created to delight in God's will, willingly disobeyed God's will. Man was seduced in the midst of God's garden of innocence by the father of lies. God's creation had always been nurtured in perfect love, honesty and provision. There had never existed within man the thought of personal desire. Need and greed were concepts never known by man.
